Course Description: This 7 hour continuing education course will focus on medical assessment of patients, monitoring, and anesthetic emergencies. Emphasis will be on the early recognition and prevention of anesthetic complications for patients receiving moderate and deep sedation as well as general anesthesia. Participants will understand how patient assessment is used to establish the risk of complications developing during the delivery of anesthesia. The limitations and benefits of invasive and noninvasive monitoring will be reviewed. The participants will be taught how to recognize and appropriately treat anesthetic emergencies. The algorithms for the management of emergencies that are tested during the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon’s “Office Anesthesia Evaluation” will be reviewed in detail.

COURSE FACULTY



O. Ross Beirne, DMD, PhD, is a Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Washington. Dr. Beirne received his DMD from Harvard School of Dental Medicine, his PhD in Biochemistry from the University of California, San Francisco, and his Certificate in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. Dr. Beirne was Assistant Professor and Associate Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of California, San Francisco from 1979-1985. He was appointed Associate Professor and Director of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residency Training Program at the University of Washington in 1985, and Chair from 1999-2010. He is currently Professor and Acting Residency Program Director in the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Washington. Dr. Beirne is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and the National Dental Board of Anesthesiology. He is a Fellow of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, the American College of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon, and the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology. He is a founding member of the National Dental Board of Anesthesiology and serves as Secretary Treasurer of the Board. Honors include election to Phi Beta Kappa, University of California, Berkeley, to Omicron Kappa Upsilon, Harvard School of Dental Medicine, and to the American College of Dentists. He is the recipient of the OMS William Gies Foundation Award from the ADEA and AAOMS. While continuing to be engaged in clinical practice and research related to oral and maxillofacial surgery, facial trauma, reconstructive surgery, implants, and anesthesia, Dr. Beirne devotes considerable time to teaching at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels.



Charles R. Weber, DMD is in full-time private practice of oral and maxillofacial surgery. Dr. Weber received a BS degree from Davidson College, in North Carolina, his DMD from the Medical College of Georgia, and his Certificate in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from Madigan Army Medical Center in Tacoma, Washington. He served in the U.S. Army Dental Corps for 21 years with his final assignment as the Program Director of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residency Program at Madigan Army Medical Center. Dr. Weber is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and has served on its Examination Committee since 2001. He is also a Diplomate of the National Dental Board of Anesthesiology. He is a Fellow of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, a Fellow of the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology, and currently serves as the Vice President of the Western Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. He has served as the Chairman of the Anesthesia Committee of the Washington State Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons since 2002. His honors include elections to Omicron Kappa Upsilon and the International College of Dentists, as well as the Surgeon General's "A" Proficiency Designator Award in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Dr. Weber practices a broad scope of oral and maxillofacial surgery and outpatient anesthesia in a three doctor practice in Olympia and Centralia, Washington.
